
The Economics PhD Program Australian National University



The Australian National University in Canberra, one of the leading universities in the Asia-Pacific region, welcomes applications for its PhD in Economics.

The program is designed both to equip candidates with the skills required to undertake cutting-edge economic research and to develop in them the breadth of knowledge and depth of understanding of economics needed to enable them to excel as professional economists in the academic, commercial and public spheres.

The program of full-time study normally occupies a period of three years, comprising two parts: two consecutive semesters of coursework designed to improve the formal training necessary for the writing of a thesis and to equip candidates with the skills to undertake research and to master the literature, followed by research and participation in seminars and/or workshops and submission of a thesis.

All Economics PhD students at the ANU participate in a common program, although they are generally co-located with their supervisors. The ANU economics program draws on distinguished faculty from

Applicants will ordinarily have a first or upper second class Honours degree in economics, or equivalent. For exceptional students, generous scholarships are available.
